# Postal Carriers Food Drive a Big Success!

Residents of Newberg provided 11,300 lbs. of food through the Stamp Out Hunger Food Drive on May 9<sup>th</sup>. That was close to the goal of 12,000 lbs. The drive was sponsored by the National Association of Letter Carriers which returned for its 23<sup>rd</sup> year.

Local organizer since 1993 and FISH volunteer, Sue Canfield, says that this food drive comes at a good time when food pantries are



low. Most food drives take place around Thanksgiving and Christmas, but food is needed all year long to meet community needs. In 2014,

11,000 lbs. of food was collected.

The participants receive 40 hours of training and are tasked with selecting. fundraising. and completing а community improvement project. Newberg RDI cohort #4 will complete our project by mid-2015. They are partnering with us to:

- 1. Install a new reception desk/counter.
- 2. Install better lighting.
- 3. Purchase new chairs for the waiting area.

4. Purchase and install new backing for the shelving units.

5. Add a children's waiting area.

The project is coming along and should be completed soon.
